

The Annual Report on Cyber Rule of Law in China (2018) (The Blue Book on the Cyber Rule of Law in China) contains monographic researches on a wide range of issues relating to the development of cyber rule of law in China in 2017, including the overall situation of development, the efforts to bring web standards under the rule of law, the protection of key information infrastructure, the construction of the national key data resource protection system, the legal system of cybersecurity, cybercrimes,

cyber warfare, management of online public opinion, the responsibility of social media platforms, international trade in cyberspace, the management of cyber ecology, and cross-border data flow, introductions to the results of third-party assessments of the situation of openness of court trial and openness of police affairs, and discussions on the emphases of future legislation on cyberspace.
